

### TUAIRISC AN CHATHAOIRLIGH CHAIRPERSON REPORT

#### A Chairde,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the members of the Committee and the wider club community for their support again this year. It was a huge relief to all of us to be able to fully enjoy our club facilities, having had limited access due to the pandemic in the previous couple of years. We have continued our programme of development of the club estate and in the first instance I would like to thank all our club volunteers and in particular the outgoing committee for the work they have done over the past twelve months.

Michael Coney Park continues to be a thriving hub at the centre of our community and it's our responsibility to ensure that it provides a welcoming and safe environment for users of all ages and abilities. The completion of our new changing, storage and toilet facilities at the training pitch in the early part of the year reflected our continued commitment to enhancement of our provision for all members of our club community. It is vital that we continue to develop and maintain these facilities while nurturing respect and pride in these vital resources for future generations.

Further enhancements this year included the resurfacing of the large stretch of carpark on the dugout side of the main pitch with a high-quality finish including spatial markings and speed reducing ramps. These works have improved the user experience and significantly enhanced our capacity to host large events such as the MacRory Cup knock-out ties which brought such colour and excitement to Michael Coney Park in the early weeks of 2022. These occasions were a great example of what we can achieve as a club community when we all pull together in the same direction.





In recent weeks we have invested significant resource in the two pitches, utilising the latest technologies in turf maintenance to ensure that we have two excellent surfaces for long periods of the year going forward. We have also expanded our gym facilities to make the most of the space available and enable larger groups to train collectively indoors.

2022 saw competitive action for all our teams at all levels, a huge positive given the challenges of COVID in previous years. We were able to participate in league and championship competitions and had many exciting days and positive outcomes for a number of our youth teams both female and male.

Our Senior Ladies retained their position in the second division for the coming season and lost out to a strong Omagh side in the championship. This team is very capable, and our experienced players are aided by fantastic young players coming through to senior football. There is no doubt this team will push on in 2023 and success won't be too far away. Our thanks to Conor Forbes, Paul O'Neill, Chris Muldoon and Louise Daly for all their dedication and work with our Senior Ladies this year.



Our Senior Men had a mixed league campaign with some great victories and a few disappointing defeats. Our championship participation came to an end with defeat to Omagh at Pomeroy. The transition and emergence of a great number of our youth players into the senior ranks was a major positive and bodes well for next year and the future generally.



Our Senior Reserves enjoyed a steady league campaign and were in contention for the league title until the latter stages of the competition. They were defeated by Omagh at home in the championship.

Sincerest thanks to all our senior players and those involved in preparing these teams. Our senior management of Mickey Donnelly, Brian Lavery, Brian McIver, Ciarán Hurl and Niall Muldoon have stepped down following two years at the helm and we are genuinely grateful for their efforts. Gavin Devlin has been appointed by the outgoing committee to lead the Senior Men in 2023 and we wish him every success going forward.

#### Mol an óige agus tiocfaidh sí ~ Praise the youth and it will prosper

We enjoyed a very busy year at youth level throughout 2022, with both male and female teams contesting county finals in various competitions and the U15 girls contesting in the All-Ireland Féile in Co. Louth. This continues to bode well for the future of the club and is an excellent reflection of the hard work put in over many years by our magnificent coaches who contribute consistently to developing our young players. Parental support is also a huge factor in this and we can only continue to progress by working together for the sake of our young people.



A great deal of work was done by our coaches at Rosa Óg and Go Games levels, with huge numbers of boys and girls participating in each age group. There were some great performances at a range of tournaments and a first experience of silverware for lots of young Rossa stars. Exciting times ahead for these young players. The highlight of the year, however, for both our boys and girls teams, came at U15 level with the boys and girls experiencing significant success.

Our U15 girls were Grade 2 Tyrone Féile champions, beating a strong Badoney side in the final to advance to the Féile All-Ireland finals. The girls only missed out on a final spot to eventual champions, St John's, Belfast. These girls also captured the Grade 2 championship, beating Cappagh in a great final. Our U16 girls retained division 1 status, with our minor girls doing likewise in division 2. The future is bright for our Senior Ladies with this talent pipeline. And we hope to see more of these girls transition into senior football in the years ahead.

Our U13 boys suffered a narrow defeat away to Carrickmore in the Championship semi-final and the U14 squad lost out to eventual Ulster champions Eglish in heat final in Coalisland. Our U15 boys recovered from a disappointing Championship loss away to Errigal Ciarán to take the League title after a fantastic victory over Cookstown at Moortown in the Final. Our U17 boys lost away to Eglish in the first round of the Championship and finished mid-table in their respective league. Our U19s lost out to Omagh on penalties in the league semi-final and we have voiced our concerns elsewhere about the manner in which



this competition is conducted at present. It is, however, heartening to see the number of this squad now involved at senior level.

Recognition is due to the endeavours of Paul McKeown (Boys) and Claire Muldoon (Girls) as Coaching Officers this past year, coordinating a wide range of teams and huge number of competitions. Likewise, a huge thank you to all of our coaches both individually and collectively and to the parents, everyone providing our young players with the support and guidance necessary for their continued development.

Thanks also to and our Child Protection/Health & Wellbeing officers and to Mr Canavan and St Patrick's Primary School staff for continued support. A lot of work has gone into developing links with the Primary School this year and our efforts have been reciprocated by school management and staff.

#### Tír Eoghain abú! ~ Come on Tyrone!

Unfortunately there was no return of Sam Maguire to the O'Neill County this year, but we were represented on the All-Ireland hurling stage by senior player and youth coach Conor McGourty, a member of the successful Tyrone team which defeated Roscommon to win the the Nicky Rackard Cup for only the second time. The GAA community in Tyrone and far beyond were stunned and greatly saddened by the sudden death of Tyrone captain Damian Casey only a few short weeks after this success in Croke Park. We were well represented in County youth squads with Leah Martin (minor), Meadhbh Campbell (U16) and Codie McCracken, Kayleigh Concannon and Ava Gilligan (U14) all representing Tyrone in their respective age groups.

A number of our young male players also represented Tyone, experiencing success at various levels: Cormac Devlin, Shea O'Hare and Peter Devlin (U20 Ulster and All Ireland winners), Conan and Conor Devlin (Minor Ulster champions), Conor Devlin, Naoise Quinn and Conall Morgan (U16 Buncrana Cup winners), Davin McKeown, Jamie Concannon and Daragh Devlin (U15 Brian McLernon Cup) while Davin McKeown and Daragh Devlin were selected for Ulster U15 Select against Dublin U16. Cormac Devlin was recognised as a Colleges Allstar and Conor Devlin received a Future Stars Award. We also had a number of players involved in successful schools teams: Daniel Quinn winning a MacRory Cup medal with St Mary's, Magherafelt, and Shay McConville, Ruairí O'Neill, Jamie Doyle and Davin McKeown experiencing Corn na nÓg success with St Patrick's Academy, Dungannon.



Unfortunately, we didn't manage to follow up on our success in Senior Scór but we had a great level of participation in Scór na nÓg with Aoibhe Sherman (Amhránaíocht Aonair/Solosinging), damhsóirí/dancers (Evie Coney, Cara McGuigan, Charlotte McNulty and Emilie Doyle) and Tráth na gCeist/Quiz team (Luke Muldoon, Cahir McKeown, Shea McConville and Conor McMurray). Lotto figures improved significantly from previous year due to the efforts of a dedicated Lotto team. The support of the Parish Centre in this regard is also crucial and is greatly appreciated. A huge effort by the Cairde Ard Bó sub-group also expanded the membership and therefore the income from our Cairde scheme.

Our Health and Well-being team got the year off to an active start for the huge turnout at our Couch to 5k programme which ran two nights a week in January and February. It was great to see walkers, joggers and runners of all ages involve and a great many families participating.



March was a busy month of fundraising before the season got started in earnest. We worked with Gerry Quinn and the Run4Fun Group to host 'Red Day' in aid of Air Ambulance, raising almost £20,000 for the charity in the process. We also held the inaugural Lap of the Lough Challenge on the same day with both our senior squads combining in mixed teams to row, cycle and run the virtual 150km around Lough Neagh. Funds raised here provided new training kits for both squads and enabled a number of team activities during the year.



At the end of March we held another successful 'Come Dine With Us' fundraiser with a huge crowd returning to the Parish Centre for the first time since the pandemic. We appreciate the support given to us by club patrons, event sponsors and the general public for this occasion and wish to record our thanks to the Events team for making this happen. We look forward to being able to bring more events back to the community on a regular basis in the year ahead.



We were delighted to work with Jim Curran's family on commemorating our former club chairman, intercounty referee and county team liaison. It was a unique occasion when neighbours Moortown came to visit for a oneoff Jim Curran Memorial Masters Match with even Peter Canavan turning up to referee the final few minutes of the game. It was a great occasion for club and family alike with a significant sum raised for Marie Curie Cancer Care as an outcome of the event.


